It's Garden Time Again!

Our Victory Village Garden is a very important part of the ministry. The grocery bill is cut down considerably by the hard work put into raising a garden. We still have some corn and peas left in the freezer from last year, as well as potatoes that should last until this year's crop is harvested. It's been over 50 years since our late Board member and Dorm builder **Harold Froese** dropped his plow into the prairie sod and said, "Let's plant watermelons!" The sandy soil of our one acre garden spot has since been worked into a nice sandy loam, and the results of each year's garden is the cooperative work of many hands.



Ed Koehn from the Garden View Church of God in Christ, Mennonite, of rural Halstead, brings a large truck load of manure which enriches the soil with an ample supply of nitrogen. **Our Students** also have an important role in planting, picking and processing the produce, and the hard work in the Kansas' sun is a very good therapy for both body and soul. We like to depend on the rain for

moisture, but weather can be variable, so we have one well reserved just for irrigation when needed.



Our Maintenance Director, **Scott Hilburn**, supervises the planting, cultivating and harvesting, and makes good use of the new tractor that was given to the ministry last year. We really appreciate that wonderful and very useful gift.

Living Dangerously In the Hands of God By Dr. Ahneka Valdois, VVCA Principal

I have a picture in my office that Tish painted, and it has the words on it, "Living Dangerously in the hands of God," an apropos sentiment for this season of my life. Every day is an adventure. When I first decided to apply to work at Victory Village. It was the results of weeks of prayer. My online teaching position was being eliminated, and I knew I was going to need, not only



another source of income, but also some way to serve others. God gave me the community at Victory Village, and I have learned so much from them.

When in that initial interview, I was asked what position I was interested in, I said, "I can teach, I can cook, I can work as dorm staff, I can fill any position." Little did I know how much that versatility would be called upon. In these last few months, I have worked almost every position, covering shortfalls in staffing. I am so grateful to God that He brought me here in this season so that I can contribute to His work in this way. Slowly, God is sending us the staff we need to fill those positions, and my focus has narrowed in on my conventional role as principal at the school. We've been very fortunate to have experienced teachers on staff who not only know what they are doing, but can also clue me in when I miss something. They deserve the credit for keeping the girls' education consistent and rigorous during this time of transition.

At the beginning of the semester, **Tish, Ashley** and **I** embarked on a journey. We didn't know what challenges we might face on the way, and I, for one, was not entirely sure I could surmount them, but I knew that God was in control, and I was confident that He would accomplish His will if we made ourselves available to be used. As that future has taken shape, I have seen His faithfulness and provision. Though the path may feel dangerous, we are never truly at risk when we are in the hands of God. We can depend on Him to fulfill His will, and even though we can't always know what His will is, we can know that it is always good. *I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord....plans to give you a future and a hope."* (Jeremiah 29:11)
