Lasting fruit is what God appointed us to produce, and here is a story that fits that description. **Chelsie Reich** came to VVCA 19 years ago, and presently lives in Hawaii with her family, pictured here. The photo at the top of the page was taken in 2011, a few days after returning from



her deployment in East Africa. Chelsie first went to Africa with **Sandy Hilburn** on a mission trip to Liberia. Later, after joining



the US Army, she was deployed to a place in East Africa. Here are the words she wrote to us following that time.

You are in my thoughts this fall. This photo was taken a few days after returning home from my deployment in 2011. Carole and Bill Cowell have followed the Lord's leading in sheltering countless teenage girls from all over the world. My life was transformed under their ministry when I was 15 years old. They endured several months of court and custody hearings, all for my sake. Never before had I experienced such unconditional love! Victory Village was the beginning of my long path home to Love, Destiny and Light.

And There Was a Great Calm!

At midnight on Monday, May 19, 2025, a tornado tried to take out my little hometown of Plevna Kansas. But God had a different plan!

I was in my basement with my mom Sondra, my husband Joe, and our neighbor Paul. The first indication that this was real was when the power went out. As the tornado passed over, there was really no noise. We could feel the pressure change a couple of times but no real indication of anything severe. Then we went outside! It was dark out and with the use of flashlights, we made our way through downed trees and power lines. The whole town was out-and-about climbing over trees, seeing if neighbors were okay, and assessing the damage. The only lights you could see, other than individual flashlights, were the flashing lights on the vehicles of the first responders and the head lights of the storm chaser's trucks. This was the scene for several hours as we all tried to take in what had just happened. (continued on page two)

The person responsible for sounding the tornado siren that night later retold how he caught a glimpse of the tornado by the light of the lightning around it. It was coming right for us and it terrified him! He hit the siren for the fourth time as he ran down the steps to get into the church basement with others who had made it there in time. From the news reports about the tornado before it hit, most people thought Plevna would be completely wiped off the map and that body bags would be needed! The tornado was thought to be wider than Plevna was long! There were, and continued to be, many signs that God calmed the storm that night. Yes, almost every tree was down or damaged. Some roots were partially gone or had huge holes in them. Windows were broken, sending glass everywhere. Our church lost the west side of its roof and the church parsonage was completely destroyed. The debris was scattered all around.

But there were no injuries!! It was also thought that the tornado lifted up a bit as it passed over town. It moved fast enough that its power had less time for greater damage. There was also no rain to ruin what open roofs exposed. After further inspection, there are several buildings in town that show they had been twisted and moved or that had been only seconds away from liftoff! We praised God for keeping His hand upon us that night!

How does this correlate to Victory Village you ask? It compares because we went through a bit of a storm during this past spring semester. But where the evil one tried to tear down, our Lord Jesus covered us with His powerful and loving hand. He had a different plan! He means for Victory Village to prosper, and we here at the Village have seen firsthand how He is doing just that! There is only one way to explain the calm that has been in me these past months. It's the same calm I had while I was in my basement during the tornado. The calm in me has had nothing to do with me and has had everything to do with the God in me!

And He awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, "Peace Be Still!" And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm ." Mark 4:39

The waves that have hit us at Victory Village these past months would have been enough to personally sink me in years past. I've had to check myself with the next verse in Mark 4 which says, *He said to them, "Why are you so afraid? Have you still no faith?" (Marak 4:40)*

I've had to decide to trust in the God I am looking to! It's not that I haven't been afraid, it's that I have come to learn to

have faith in the God who walks before me and with me. He has been putting all things together for our good!

Things don't look exactly the same as they used to in Plevna or at Victory Village, but we trust in the calming hand that brought us through the storm! The same hand that is bringing beauty out of the change!

This looks like a happy family! Nicole Estell came to us in 2002 from Minneola, Kansas. Her life has not been easy, but she is a survivor and has weathered many of life's storms. Her husband James is working currently as a heavy Equipment operator. Their child-



ren are **Ganynn** and **Gracelynn**. They live in Colorado. We enjoy keeping in touch with our former students, doing what we can to encourage them as they continue on the road of life. Nicole has reached out to us on occasions with important spiritual questions, and we have done what we could to encourage her. She wrote, *I hope this finds you both healthy and well. I can never thank you enough for all you did for me! I love you both!*

Staff and some family members came to help harvest our potato crop. The potatoes will dry out on the floor of the dorm's downstairs Big room, and then will be stored in the walk-in cooler, hopefully lasting until the 2026 crop.
